Our privacy policy

The Royal Artillery Centre for Personal Development (RACPD) is committed to protecting your privacy.

When you contact us or visit our website, your personal information is stored securely and processed fairly as required by the Data Protection Act 1998.

Our privacy policy explains the following:

- What information the RACPD may collect about you.
- How the RACPD will use your information and ensure this is not shared with organisations outside the company.
- How long your information may be held on our system.

How we collect information

We collect personal information when you

- Register online through our website
- Complete a form or questionnaire
- Contact us by phone, post or email

In addition, information is automatically captured each time you visit our website. We use cookies (see below) and collect IP addresses (that can uniquely identify a specific computer or network device on the internet) to track visitors to our websites.

What we do with this information

We use the personal information you provide to answer your enquiries and to make improvements to our website.

We do not share personal information

RACPD will not share your personal details with any external organisations.

How long do we keep your information?

Your information will be held on our systems for as long as is necessary to answer your requests and maintain a dialogue with those individuals who remain interested in the RACPD.

Will I be contacted by the RACPD for marketing purposes?

We will only contact or send information about the RACPD to those people who have given us permission to do so.

We will only provide information that is relevant to you.

Cookie Description	Purpose	More Information
Google Analytics	Used to collect information about how visitors use our site. We use the information to compile reports and to help us improve our services. The cookies collect information in an anonymous form, including the number of visitors to the site, the location of our visitors and the pages they visited. Authentication	This cookie is set when you log into our website.	
Unique ID	Long-term cookie we use to identify your browser in between different sessions.	
Session ID	Helps us to maintain short-term state information about your browsing session.
